The Democratic Leadership Council Joins with Top Labor Organizations to Endorse the Employee Free Choice Act

Workers should have the right to request union representation without being subjected to intimidation or lengthy battles, according to the Democratic Leadership Council and labor leaders. Iowa Governor and DLC Chair Tom Vilsack, AFL-CIO President John Sweeney, Change to Win Federation Chair Anna Burger, AFSCME President Gerald McEntee and United Steelworkers International President Leo Gerard reiterated their support for the Employee Free Choice Act (EFCA). The Act, which was reintroduced to Congress last year, seeks to strengthen worker protection by requiring that employers recognize unions when the majority of workers request representation, as well as provide mediation and arbitration of first-contract disputes. The act also authorizes stronger penalties for violations when workers are prevented from forming unions.

Helmets to Hardhats

Helmets to Hardhats is a national program that connects transitioning active-duty and reservecomponent military with training and employment opportunities within the construction industry. Currently there are 1,482 employers and local trade unions that have posted 3,356 career opportunities on the Helmets to Hardhats Web site. The program allows candidates to start construction careers soon after they apply, and also gives them credit for military training and experience. The intent of the program is to help those with military experience get hired in civilian construction trades that the program's organizers claim are facing a critical labor shortage. The program emphasizes jobs that offer higher than average wages and benefits. A recent national survey indicates that union workers earn an average of \$4.08 more per hour than non-union construction workers. www.helmetstohardhats.org

FACT: NAFTA has caused the loss of 750,00 U.S. jobs. (U.S. Department of Labor)

FACT:On April 20, 1914, James Fyler died of acute lead poisoning. He had been shot fifty-four times.

In 1914 in Ludlow Colorado, nine thousand mineworkers were on for strike better working conditions and higher wages. John D. Rockefeller's CF&I refused to recognize the Union, give an eight hour work day, abolish armed guards, or enforce state employment laws. By April, the National Guard had been called in and were camped on the hills above Ludlow Station. On Monday morning, April 20, 1914, the National Guardsman opened fire with a machine gun and rifles. The miners shot back but at the days end forty miners and their families were killed, including eleven children and two women, their tents set afire. James Fyler, the Union Secretary, was shot 54 times because he believed that workers should collect some of the fruit of their own labor.
